

Joliet Area USBC Association – Youth Scholarship Guidelines

The following is a list of guidelines used to govern the application evaluation and presentation of the annual Joliet Area USBC Association Youth Scholarships. These guidelines are reviewed and updated on an annual basis and reflect the changes that were made for the 2021-2022 season.

1. Completed applications must be returned to your head coach **by July 23, 2022**. Please include first class postage with extra ounce stamp for weight for mailing to your coach. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Please provide email address to receive confirmation receipt that the Scholarship Committee Chair has received your application.
2. Scholarship applications are available to **ANY** youth bowler from age 12 through age 18 (as of 08/01/2021) that has not reached or exceeded a \$3,000 total of written scholarship awards through the JAUSBCA.
**Note – Tournament winnings do not apply to the \$3,000 award cap.
3. Points for most sections are subjective and are awarded by several impartial judges. High and low scores are omitted, and the rest are tallied and averaged to determine total points per candidate. There will be no split between boys and girls.

Scholarships awarded are as follows:

1 st Place High Points	\$ 800	5 th Place High Points	\$ 400
2 nd Place High Points	\$ 700	6 th Place High Points	\$ 300
3 rd Place High Points	\$ 600	7 th Place High Points	\$ 200
4 th Place High Points	\$ 500		

The scholarships will be awarded at the Joliet Area USBC Association Youth Awards Ceremony in September 2021.

4. Scholarship applicants must be sure that a coach's evaluation form is included from each league they participate in. For each evaluation form that is missing, **15 points will be subtracted** from the applicants' final score. Applicants must bowl at least 36 games in any league to qualify for a scholarship (pre-bowls do not count for qualification).
5. Only Head Coaches may fill out the coaches' evaluation form.
6. Scholarship applications and the two (2) essay questions must be legibly written or typed double-spaced.
7. Any ties in the scholarship evaluation will be awarded the amount over two consecutive spots and split.
8. All scholarship awards are held in SMART #12469.
9. The format for the evaluation will be as follows:
 - A. Candidate Questionnaire
 - B. Tournament Participation
 - C. Club Involvement & Volunteer Work
 - D. Essay Questions
 - E. Coach's Evaluations

Grade point average: Actual Grade point average is multiplied by 4, with an "A" average equaling 4 and the maximum points being given is 16. **This will be calculated by the Scholarship Committee Chair.* All averages are recalculated with no "+" or "-" taken into account nor extra credit for honors classes.

2. Composite average Bracket: 191 & above = 6 points, 181-190 = 5.5 points, 171-180 = 5 points, 161-170 = 4.5 points, 151-160 = 4 points, 141-150 = 3.5 points, 131-140 = 3 points, 121-130 = 2.5 points, 111-120 = 2 points, 101-110 = 1.5 points, 91-100 = 1 point, 81-90 = 0.5 points.

2. There is a new bowler on the team next to you, they're new to the sport and they are getting frustrated, what would you do?
